Hello Everyone,

You're receiving this email because you have a fourth-grade daughter in my classroom. Over the past few weeks there seems to be issues popping up between girls in the class. Some of the girls have come and talked to me about things, while others have written to me about it in their writing journal. After several girls approached me today at lunch with an issue, I decided it would be best to have a meeting with all of the girls. Without naming names the girls talked a lot about what kinds of things have been going on.

Exclusion and gossip were probably the two biggest issues, but of course boys were mentioned, too. I wanted you to be aware of what's going on. This seems to be something that's just recently started, so I wanted to try to talk about it with them before the issues become much bigger. I left them with two things to remember: 1. Put yourself in someone else's shoes and think about how you would feel if you were them and 2. Be careful of how you speak to one another. I would appreciate it if you could also talk with them about the specific issues that I mentioned.

I care a lot about each and every one of these girls and of course I want them all to be happy. There will be issues that arise and not everyone will always be happy, but it's just not okay for them to be disrespectful to one another. I would appreciate your support with this.
